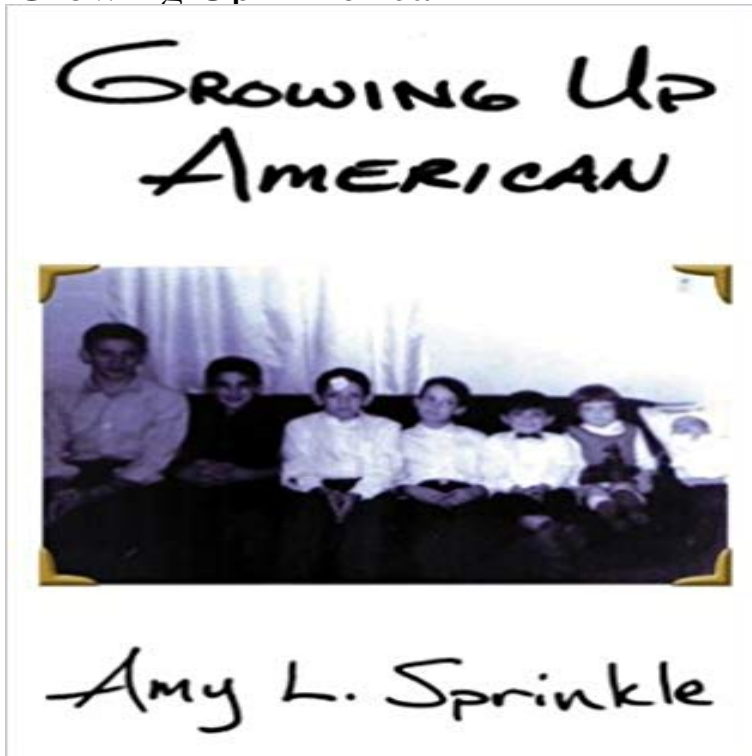


Growing Up American
